## Information About Your Will

- 1. You should keep a copy of your Will with your private papers. You should tell your Executors who the original Will is deposited with.
- 2. If you marry after the date of your Will it will, in most cases, be automatically revoked and you should consult your solicitor again.
- 3. In the following circumstances, you are advised to contact your solicitors:
  - (a) If you change your name, or anyone mentioned in the Will changes their name;
  - (b) If an Executor dies or becomes unsuitable to act due to age, ill-health, or for other reasons;
  - (c) If a Beneficiary dies; or
  - (d) If you have bequeathed any property, which you subsequently sell, or which changes its nature.
- 4. If you wish at any time to revoke or alter your Will you should consult your solicitor so that the legal formalities can be observed, otherwise your wishes may not take effect.
- 5. If at any time you wish to make a bequest to a Charitable Trust please contact your solicitor who will be happy to discuss this with you.
